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Key Messages:

- Peel Public Health is now accepting expired and excess Influenza vaccine returns.
- COVID-19 Spring 2023 Campaign is underway.

<u>Universal Influenza Immunization Program (UIIP):</u> 2022/2023 Influenza Return

Please return **all** expired and excess influenza vaccine(s) to the Region of Peel - Public Health by **May 31, 2023**.

Vaccine Return Process

- Complete Section B of the Vaccine Cold Chain and/or Wastage Report available at: https://peelregion.ca/health/professionals/pdfs/V-07-739.pdf
- Place the completed Vaccine Cold Chain and/or Wastage Report along with the returned vaccine(s) in a sealed or stapled bag.
- 3. Vaccines being returned as unusable or expired **DO NOT** need to be returned in **cold chain**.
- 4. Return vaccines to any of these locations:
 - Hurontario 7120 Hurontario Street,
 Mississauga (Monday to Friday: 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM)
 - Fairview 325 Central Parkway West, Unit 21, Mississauga (Monday to Friday: 9:00AM to 4:00 PM)
 - Brampton 150 Central Park Drive, Suite 9
 Brampton (Monday to Friday: 9:00 AM to 4:00
 PM; closed 12:00 PM to 1:00 PM)

NOTE: If you are part of the vaccine delivery program, vaccines can be returned via the courier.

If you continue to receive requests for influenza vaccine for the 2022/2023 season, consider maintaining a **minimal stock** of influenza vaccine (with careful attention to expiry dates) in cold chain to accommodate these requests.

REMINDER:

Other publicly funded vaccines that are deemed unusable (e.g., affected by a cold chain failure) or expired should be returned to Region of Peel - Public Health as soon as possible.

REMINDER: COVID-19 Vaccine Spring 2023 Campaign

This spring, the recommendation for high-risk groups is to be offered a bivalent booster at a minimum interval of six months from last COVID-19 dose or infection. Encourage high-risk groups in your practice to stay up to date with their COVID-19 vaccinations.

These groups include:

- Individuals 65 years and older
- Residents of long-term care homes, retirement homes, and residents living in other congregate settings or those with complex medical needs
- Individuals 18 years and older with moderate to severe immunocompromising conditions
- Pregnant individuals



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 Individuals 55 years and older who identify as First Nations, Inuit or Métis and their non-Indigenous household members 55 years and older
