Key Messages:

- March Break Catch-up clinics are available to grade
 9 to 12 students that were unable to get the HPV,
 Hepatitis B, and Meningococcal (Men-C-ACYW)
 vaccines at school.
- Instruct your eligible patients in grade 9-12 to book an appointment at a Peel Public Health (PPH) clinic.
- PPH is mailing Orders of Suspension to Junior Kindergarten to Grade 1 students who have not provided updated immunization records.
- PPH is not currently offering clinics for antigens required under ISPA with the exception of Men-C-ACYW for adolescents.

March Break School Vaccination Program Catch-up Clinics

Catch-up clinics will be available over March Break to students in **grade 9 to 12** that may have missed their opportunity to get the HPV, Hepatitis B, and Meningococcal (Men-C-ACYW) vaccines at school.

Reminder: Immunization School Pupils Act (ISPA) - Orders of Suspension

Peel Public Health is mailing Orders of Suspension to students in **Junior Kindergarten to Grade 1** who have not provided updated immunization records as outlined in the Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA) for the following diseases:

- diphtheria
- tetanus
- polio
- measles
- mumps

- rubella
- meningitis (meningococcal disease)
- whooping cough (pertussis)
- chickenpox (varicella) required for children born in 2010 or later.

Note: PPH is not currently offering clinics for antigens required under ISPA with the exception of Men-C-ACYW for adolescents.

If a student presents at your practice with an Order of Suspension, follow these steps:

- Review your records of the student's immunization history:
 - If the student has already received the vaccine(s) listed on the letter, provide the immunization date, product, and product lot number to the parent/guardian.
 - Administer the vaccine(s) if the student has not received the vaccine(s).
- 2. Remind parents to report their child's immunizations to PPH:
